

Title: Plant Parts - Plant Shadow Art

Learning objective: To learn the English names of the main parts of a plant

Materials needed:

White paper
Pencil
Colouring materials such as crayons, chalks, or paints

Introduction to lesson:

For the fourth lesson, we will make a piece of plant shadow art. This activity should take place outside on a sunny day in the early morning or late afternoon when shadows are long. You will need to find some plants or trees outside to use for the activity. After creating the plant shadow art, we will complete three additional activities to learn the English words for different plant parts: a vocabulary exercise, a word search and an activity to complete some sentences with missing words.

Find a place outside near some interesting plants or trees that you would like to use for your shadow art. Place a piece of paper under the plants so they cast a shadow onto it. Use a pencil to trace around the shadow of the plants. You can be creative by drawing around the shadows of many different plants to create a garden scene. Colour in the shadow shapes with your chosen colouring materials. Once finished, you can use your artwork for a greetings card, or hang it on the wall for everyone to enjoy!

Look at each of the plant parts and say the English words for them. You can listen to the words and practise saying them first, then practise writing them.

Look at the different plant parts you have been learning in English and try to find them all in the grid. How quickly can you find them? You must find the word by finding all the letters in the word together in the correct order - this can either be forwards, backwards, up, down or diagonal.

There are ten sentences in this activity. Each sentence has a missing word that is a plant part. Find the correct missing word and put it in the space to complete each sentence. There is one missing word for each sentence.
