

**Title:** Garden Animals - Leaf Butterflies

**Learning objective:** To learn the English names for garden animals

**Materials needed:**

2 large leaves  
2 medium leaves (with stalks attached)  
Small twig  
White, black and orange paint  
Thin paintbrushes  
Strong glue  
Sewing thread

**Introduction to lesson:**

For the final lesson, we are going to make a "Painted Lady" leaf butterfly and learn the names of the main parts of a butterfly. We will then complete three additional activities to learn the English words for different garden animals: a vocabulary exercise, a word search and an activity to complete some sentences with missing words.

**Craft activity: Leaf butterflies** - <https://reepinfo.org/agdz-8-craft>

Cut the leaf stalks from the medium leaves and glue them to the top of the twig to make the butterfly antennae. Glue the two medium leaves at the bottom of the twig and the two larger leaves above them. Once the glue is dry, carefully paint the leaves to look like the wings of a Painted lady butterfly - orange with black edges covered in white spots. Once the paint is dry, cut a small length of thread and tie it to the twig so you can hang up your butterfly for others to enjoy.

Look at each of the garden animals and say the English words for them. You can listen to the words and practise saying them first, then practise writing them.

Look at the garden animals you have been learning in English and try to find them all in the grid. How quickly can you find them? You must find the word by finding all the letters in the word together in the correct order - this can either be forwards, backwards, up, down or diagonal.

There are ten sentences in this activity. Each sentence has a missing word that is a garden animal. Find the correct missing word and put it in the space to complete each sentence. There is one missing word for each sentence.
